

FRENCH IMMERSION

Immersion French FIF1DR Grade 9, (Academic)

This course provides opportunities for students to speak and interact in French independently in a variety of real-life and personally relevant contexts. Students will develop their ability to communicate in French with confidence by using language-learning strategies introduced in the elementary French Immersion program. Students will enhance their knowledge of the language through the study of French-Canadian literature. They will also continue to increase their understanding and appreciation of diverse French-speaking communities and to develop the skills necessary to become life-long language learners. This course is intended for graduates of Grade 8 Immersion.

Immersion French FIF1PR Grade 9, (Applied)

This course provides opportunities for students to communicate and exchange information in French in a variety of real-life situations, with support as appropriate. They will also continue to increase their understanding and appreciation of diverse French-speaking communities and to develop the skills necessary to become life-long language learners. This course is intended for graduates of Grade 8 Immersion.

Issues in Canadian Geography – in French CGC1DI Grade 9, (Academic)

THIS COURSE RUNS ALTERNATE YEARS.

NOT OFFERED IN 2018-2019

This course examines interrelationships within and between Canada's natural and human systems and how these systems interconnect with those in other parts of the world. Students will explore environmental, economic, and social geographic issues relating to topics such as transportation options, energy choices, and urban development. Students will apply the concepts of geographic thinking and the geographic inquiry process, including spatial technologies, to investigate various geographic issues and to develop possible approaches for making Canada a more sustainable place to live. This course is intended for graduates of grade 8 Immersion.

Prerequisite: *Grade 8 French Immersion*

Immersion French FIF2DR Grade 10, (Academic)

This course provides students with extensive opportunities to communicate, interact, and think critically and creatively in French. Students will use a variety of language-learning strategies in listening, speaking, reading, and writing, and will respond to and interact with print, oral, visual, and electronic texts. Students will develop their knowledge of the French language through the study of contemporary and historically well-known French literature. They will also continue to increase their understanding and appreciation of diverse French-speaking communities and to develop the skills necessary to become life-long language learners.

Canadian History since World War I – in French
CHC2DI
Grade 10, (Academic)

THIS COURSE RUNS ALTERNATE YEARS.

OFFERED IN 2018-2019

This course explores social, economic, and political developments and events and their impact on the lives of different groups in Canada since 1914. Students will examine the role of conflict and cooperation in Canadian society, Canada's evolving role within the global community, and the impact of various individuals, organizations, and events on Canadian identity, citizenship, and heritage. They will develop their ability to apply the concepts of historical thinking and the historical inquiry process, including the interpretation and analysis of evidence, when investigating key issues and events in Canadian history since 1914. This course will broaden Extended French students' French communication skills.

Prerequisite: *Grade 9 French Immersion or Grade 9 Academic Core French*

Civics and Citizenship - in Immersion French
CHV2OI
Grade 10, (Open), (Half Credit)

This course explores rights and responsibilities associated with being an active citizen in a democratic society. Students will explore issues of civic importance such as healthy schools, community planning, environmental responsibility, and the influence of social media, while developing their understanding of the role of civic engagement and of political processes in the local, national, and/or global community. Students will apply the concepts of political thinking and the political inquiry process to investigate, and express informed opinions about, a range of political issues and developments that are both of significance in today's world and of personal interest to them.

Prerequisite: *Grade 9 French Immersion or Grade 9 Academic Core French*

Career Studies – in French
GLC2OI
Grade 10, (Open), (Half Credit)

This course teaches students how to develop and achieve personal goals for future learning, work, and community involvement. Students will assess their interests, skills, and characteristics and investigate current economic and workplace trends, work opportunities, and ways to search for work. The course explores postsecondary learning and career options, prepares students for managing work and life transitions and helps students focus on their goals through the development of a career plan.

Prerequisite: *Grade 9 French Immersion or Grade 9 Academic Core French*

Immersion French**FIF3UR****Grade 11, (University Preparation)**

This course provides opportunities for students to consolidate the communication skills required to speak and interact with increasing confidence and accuracy in French in a variety of academic and social contexts. Students will apply language-learning strategies while exploring a variety of concrete and abstract topics, and will increase their knowledge of the language through the study of French literature from around the world. They will also continue to deepen their understanding and appreciation of diverse French-speaking communities and to develop the skills necessary to become life-long language learners.

Prerequisite: *Grade 10 Immersion French (FIF2DR)*

World History to the End of the Fifteenth Century (Ancient History) - in French**CHW3MI****Grade 11, (University/College Preparation)**

THIS COURSE RUNS ALTERNATE YEARS.

NOT OFFERED IN 2018-2019

This course explores the history of various societies around the world, from earliest times to around 1500 CE. Students will examine life in and the legacy of various ancient and pre-modern societies throughout the world, including those in, Africa, Asia, Europe, and the Americas. Students will extend their ability to apply the concepts of historical thinking and the historical inquiry process, including the interpretation and analysis of evidence, when investigating social, political, and economic structures and historical forces at work in various societies and in different historical eras. This history course is for students who are in the extended French program.

Prerequisite: *Grade 9 Immersion French (FIF1DR)*

Media Studies – in French**EMS3OI****Grade 11, (Open)**

THIS COURSE RUNS ALTERNATE YEARS.

NOT OFFERED IN 2018-2019

This course emphasizes knowledge and skills that will enable students to understand media communication in the twenty-first century and to use media effectively and responsibly. Through analyzing the forms and messages of a variety of media works and audience responses to them, and through creating their own media works, students will develop critical thinking skills, aesthetic and ethical judgment, and skills in viewing, representing, listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Through viewing French language films, commercials, Television and websites, students will become critical consumers of media and understand the impact of media in our society.

Prerequisite: *Grade 10 Immersion French (FIF2DR), Core French, Academic (FSF2DR)*

Outdoor Activities – in French**PAD3OI****Grade 11, (Open)**

THIS COURSE RUNS ALTERNATE YEARS.

OFFERED IN 2018-2019

This course concentrates on the development of a healthy lifestyle and participation in a variety of enjoyable outdoor physical activities in which students can continue to participate throughout their lives, such as: paddling skills, canoe tripping, hiking, cross country skiing, and winter camping. A focus will be placed on personal and group safety in an outdoor setting. The focus in this course will be on large and small group activities in an outdoor setting.

Prerequisite: *Grade 10 Immersion French (FIF2DR) or Core French (FSF2DR)*

Immersion French

FIF4UR

Grade 12, (University Preparation)

This course provides students with extensive opportunities to communicate, interact, and think critically and creatively in French. Students will consolidate language-learning strategies and apply them while communicating about concrete and abstract topics, and will independently respond to and interact with a variety of oral and written texts. Students will study a selection of French literature from the Middle Ages to the present. They will also continue to enrich their understanding and appreciation of diverse French-speaking communities and to develop the skills necessary to become life-long language learners.

Prerequisite: *Grade 11 Immersion French, University Preparation (FIF3UR)*
