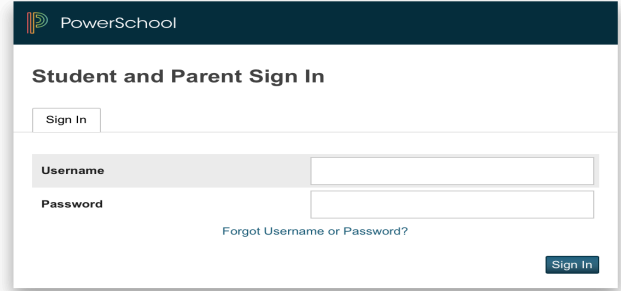

- OSSLT (Gr. 10 EQAO standardized literacy test)

Additional Requirements

- 40 hours of community involvement
